This Grant Agreement ("Agreement") is hereby made by and between: 114 1st Ave E, Mobridge, SD, 576001. ("Grantee") and the Division of History, State Historic Preservation Office, South Dakota Department of Education, 900 Governors Drive, Pierre, South Dakota 57501 ("SHPO").

Acceptance of this grant is indication of Grantee's willingness to conduct the project in conformance with the following conditions. Failure to do so may result in the termination of the grant or reduction of the grant amount in accordance with Section 20 below. This agreement must be signed and returned to accept the grant award.

- 1. **SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR'S STANDARDS** Grantee shall read the Secretary of the Interior's *Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties: Rehabilitation*, provided by SHPO, and ensure that all work completed will comply with these Standards.
- 2. **PRESERVATION COVENANT** Grantee agrees to sign and file an eight-year restrictive covenant on the deed of the property, running with the property, which states that the property will be maintained in a manner that preserves its historic integrity. All work performed on the property within the covenant period must meet the Secretary of the Interior's *Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties: Rehabilitation*. Proof of filing must be provided to the SHPO before any grant payments will be processed. Under the terms of the covenant, Grantee must provide the SHPO with written prior notification of any proposed project or work on the property within the covenant period. This covenant will not be removed for any reason prior to the termination date.
- 3. **GRANT PAYMENTS** All grant payments will be made on a reimbursement basis upon receipt of copies of the invoice and proof of payment at the completion of the work. All grant conditions must be met before the SHPO will process any payments. The SHPO reserves the right to inspect completed work before any payments.
- 4. **REQUIRED MATCH** This grant must be matched with non-federal sources on at least a dollar-for-dollar basis. Documentation of the match contributions must be submitted when requesting reimbursement. [SHPO may waive this condition for non-profit historical organizations, municipalities, and other local governmental entities for projects that will have a public use (SDCL 1-19A-13.3).]
- 5. **PHOTOGRAPHS** Clear photos of all completed work must be submitted with or prior to the request for reimbursement. Digital photos are acceptable.
- 6. **GRANT PERIOD** All work funded by the grant must occur within the grant period as indicated in the header of this Agreement. No payments will be made for work completed outside of the Agreement period.



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- 7. **GRANT EXTENSIONS OR AMENDMENTS** Any deadline extension requests or revisions to the approved scope of work must be submitted to the SHPO in writing for approval. Deadline extensions may be granted for up to one year. Additional extensions may be considered in limited instances. Changes to scope of work will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
- 8. **W-9** Grantee must complete a W-9 form (federal, or state equivalent) at the time of accepting the grant award. SHPO will provide this form and it can be returned to SHPO when completed. If the grant is extended beyond 12 months, a new W-9 form may need to be submitted.
- 9. **PROJECT SIGN** A sign provided by SHPO must be posted at the project site. The sign will state that the project has been funded in part by the South Dakota State Historical Society through the Deadwood Fund and must remain posted for the duration of the project.
- 10. **FEDERAL ASSURANCES AND DEBARMENT** By completing this form, Grantee certifies compliance with the following certified assurances:

This program receives Federal financial assistance from the National Park Service. Grants are subject to the requirements outlined in OMB Circulars A-133, A-87, A-110, and A-122. Grantee agrees to abide by all federal and state regulations, including the following certified assurances.

The Grantee agrees to comply with all Federal statues relating to nondiscrimination. These include but are not limited to: Executive Order 11246 Equal Employment Opportunity as amended by Executive Order 11375 and implementing regulations at 41 C.F.R. part 60; Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (P.L. 88-352) 42 USC 2000d, et seq.; Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968; Executive Order 11764 and Department of Interior Regulation (43 CFR 17); Byrd Anti Lobbying Amendment (31 USC 1352); Debarment and Suspension (Executive Orders 12549 and 12689 and 2 C.F.R. 180); Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (P.L. 93-112 as amended); Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, as amended; the Drug Abuse Office and Treatment Act of 1972 (P.L. 92-255), as amended; Comprehensive Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism Prevention, Treatment and Rehabilitation Act of 1970; Age Discrimination Act of 1975; the American With Disabilities Act 1990 (P.L. 101-366); Pro-Children Act of 1994; Hatch Act; Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) of 1996 as amended; Clean Air Act; Federal Water Pollution Control Act; Charitable Choice Provisions and Regulations; Equal Treatment for Faith-Based Religions at Title 28 Code of Federal Regulations Part 38; the Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act of 2013; American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, as applicable; and any other nondiscrimination provisions is the specific statue(s) under which application for Federal assistance is being made; and the requirements of any other nondiscrimination statute(s) which may apply to the award.

The Grantee hereby certifies that it meets all requirements regarding Federal debt status and Federal debarment and suspension, and that it will provide a drug-free workplace in

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compliance with the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988. This assurance shall obligate the Grantee for the period during which the Federal financial assistance is extended.

**Debarment and Suspension** -The Grantee certifies to the best of his or her knowledge and belief that the Grantee or its principals (a) are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any Federal department or agency; (b) has not within a three-period preceding this proposal been convicted of or had a civil judgment rendered against him or her for commission of fraud or a criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain, or performing a public (federal, state, or local) transaction or contract under a public transaction; violation of federal or state antitrust statutes; or commission of embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, making false statements, or receiving stolen property; (c) is not presently indicted for or otherwise criminally or civilly charged by a governmental entity (federal, state, or local) with commission of any of the offenses enumerated in paragraph (b) of this certification; and (d) has not within a three-year period preceding this application had one or more public transactions (federal, state, or local) terminated for cause or default.

Grantee further agrees that it will immediately notify the SHPO if during the term of this Agreement it or its principals become subject to debarment, suspension or ineligibility from participating in transactions by the federal government, or by any state or local government department or agency.

Consistent with 41 US.C. 10a-10c, "Buy American Act," Grantees who are purchasing equipment and products through an Endowment-supported grant are encouraged, whenever possible, to purchase American-made equipment and products.

Grantee will comply, as applicable, with the provisions of the **Davis-Bacon Act** (40 U.S.C. §§ 276a to 276a-7), **the Copeland Act** (40 U.S.C. § 276c and 18 U.S.C. §§ 874) and **the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act** (40 U.S.C. §§ 327-333), regarding labor standards for federally assisted construction sub agreements.

Grantee will comply with the Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act of 1990 (25 U.S.C. 3001 et seq.), which applies to any organization which controls or possesses Native American human remains and associated funerary objects, and which receives Federal funding, even for a purpose unrelated to the Act.



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Grantee will comply with **the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act of 1968** (16 U.S.C. §§ 1721 et seq.) related to protecting components or potential components of the national wild and scenic rivers system.

Grantee will assist the awarding agency in assuring compliance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended (16 U.S.C. § 470), EO 11593 (identification and protection of historic properties), and the Archaeological and Historic Preservation Act of 1974 (16 U.S.C. §§ 469a-1 et seq.).

A local government or a nonprofit organization must comply with all state audit requirements, including: 2 CFR Part 200 Subpart F – Audit Requirements; and any other application law or regulation,

- Audit required. A non-Federal entity that expends \$1,000,000 or more during the non-Federal entity's fiscal year in Federal awards must have a single or program-specific audit conducted for that year in accordance with the provisions of this part.
- Single audit. A non-Federal entity that expends \$1,000,000 or more during the non-Federal entity's fiscal year in Federal awards must have a single audit conducted in accordance with § 200.514 Scope of audit except when it elects to have a program-specific audit conducted in accordance with paragraph (c) of this section.
- Program-specific audit election. When an auditee expends Federal awards under only one Federal program (excluding R&D) and the Federal program's statutes, regulations, or the terms and conditions of the Federal award do not require a financial statement audit of the auditee, the auditee may elect to have a program-specific audit conducted in accordance with § 200.507 Program-specific audits. A program-specific audit may not be elected for R&D unless all of the Federal awards expended were received from the same Federal agency, or the same Federal agency and the same pass-through entity, and that Federal agency, or pass-through entity in the case of a grantee, approves in advance a program-specific audit.
- Exemption when Federal awards expended are less than \$1,000,000. A non-Federal entity that expends less than \$1,000,000 during the non-Federal entity's fiscal year in Federal awards is exempt from Federal audit requirements for that year, except as noted in § 200.503 Relation to other audit requirements, but records must be available for review or audit by appropriate officials of the Federal agency, pass-through entity, and Government Accountability Office (GAO).
- For-profit Grantees. Since this part does not apply to for-profit grantees, the pass-through entity is responsible for establishing requirements, as necessary, to ensure compliance by for-profit grantees. The agreement with the for-profit grantee should describe applicable compliance requirements and the for-profit grantee's compliance responsibility. Methods to ensure compliance for Federal awards made to for-profit grantees may include pre-award audits, monitoring during the agreement, and post-award audits.



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After completion of the audit, SHPO requires that Grantee to send a copy of the audit to SHPO with 30 calendar days. The Grantee shall be responsible for payment of any and all audit exceptions related to the work performed under this Agreement which are identified by SHPO. Notwithstanding any other condition of the Agreement, the cooperative audit resolution process applies, as appropriate. The books and records of the Grantee must be made available if needed and upon request, at the Grantee's regular place of business, for audit by personnel authorized by SHPO. SHPO has the right to return to audit the program after close-out at any time during the record retention period, and to conduct recovery audits including the recovery of funds, as appropriate.

- 11. **GRANTEE ATTESTATION** By completing this form, Grantee attests to meeting the following requirements per SDCL 1-56-10.
  - 1) A conflict-of-interest policy is enforced within the Grantee's organization;
  - 2) The Internal Revenue Service Form 990 has been filed, if applicable, in compliance with federal law, and is displayed immediately after filing on the Grantee's website;
  - 3) An effective internal control system is employed by the Grantee's organization; and
  - 4) If applicable, the Grantee is in compliance with the federal Single Audit Act, in compliance with § 4-11-2.1, and audits are displayed on the Grantee's website.

Grantee further represents that any and all concerns or issues it had in complying with the foregoing attestations were provided to SHPO and resolved to their satisfaction prior to signing this Agreement.

If Grantee is a non-state agency they agree to disclose to SHPO, in writing, any conflicts of interest that exist under the Grantee's conflict-of-interest policy. SHPO will publicly post any disclosed conflicts of interest along with the corresponding grant agreement on the OpenSD website.

In the event of a significant change in the conflict-of-interest policy, Grantee agrees to provide immediate notice of such change to the SHPO, and provide a copy of the new conflict of interest policy. Grantee understands that any change in the conflict-of-interest policy may result in a change in their monitoring or other performance requirements under the Agreement and expressly agrees to comply with those changes and to facilitate any additional monitoring as required by SHPO.

12. **PUBLICITY** – All press releases and printed material about the project should state that it has been funded in part by the South Dakota State Historical Society through the Deadwood Fund Grant program. Copies of any press releases or newspaper articles concerning the grant project should be sent to SHPO. SHPO should be informed of any dedications or ceremonies held at the completion of the project.



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- 13. **RETENTION OF RECORDS** All financial records, supporting documents, statistical records, and any other records pertinent to the grant must be retained for three years after completion of the project.
- 14. **LIABILITY** Grantee agrees to hold harmless and indemnify the State of South Dakota, its officers, agents and employees, from and against any and all actions, suits, damages, liability or other proceedings which may arise as a result of performing services hereunder. This section does not require the Grantee to be responsible for or defend against claims or damages arising solely from errors or omissions of the SHPO, its officers, agents or employees.
- 15. **INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR/GRANTEE** While performing services hereunder, the Grantee is an independent and not an officer, agent or employee of the State of South Dakota. The Grantee will provide SHPO with its Employer Identification Number, Federal Tax Identification Number or Social Security Number; UEI Number; and SAM registration upon execution of this Agreement.
- 16. **COMPLIANCE WITH OPEN RECORDS LAWS** The parties mutually agree that neither of them shall disclose the contents of the agreement except as required by applicable law or as necessary to carry out the terms of the agreement or to enforce that party's rights under this agreement. Grantee acknowledges that SHPO and its agencies are public entities and thus are bound by South Dakota open meetings and open records laws. It is therefore not a breach of this agreement for SHPO to take any action that SHPO reasonably believes is necessary to comply with the South Dakota open records or open meetings laws, including but not limited to posting this Agreement on SHPO's website. If work assignment performed in the course of this Agreement required security requirements or clearance, the Grantee will be required to undergo investigation.
- 17. **GOVERNING LAW AND VENUE** This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of South Dakota. Any lawsuit pertaining to or affecting this Agreement shall be venued in Circuit Court, Sixth Judicial Circuit, Hughes County, South Dakota.
- 18. **RESTRICTION OF BOYCOTT OF ISRAEL** Pursuant to Executive Order 2020-01, for grantees with five (5) or more employees who enter into an agreement with the State of South Dakota that involves the expenditure of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) or more, by signing this Agreement the Grantee certifies and agrees that it has not refused to transact business activities, have not terminated business activities, and has not taken other similar actions intended to limit its commercial relations, related to the subject matter of the agreement, with a person or entity that is either the State of Israel, or a company doing business in or with Israel or authorized by, licensed by, or organized under the laws of the State of Israel to do business, or doing business in the State of Israel, with the specific intent to accomplish a boycott or divestment of Israel in a discriminatory manner. It is understood and agreed that, if this certification is false, such false certification will constitute grounds for SHPO to terminate this agreement. Grantee further agrees to provide immediate written notice to SHPO if during the term of the agreement it no longer complies

with this certification and agrees such noncompliance may be grounds for contract termination.

- 19. **PROHIBIT "INHERENTLY DIVISIVE CONCEPTS"** Pursuant to Executive Order 2022-02, Grantee certifies and agrees that all actions taken in performance with this Agreement will not promote inherently divisive concepts or direct or compel any department employees, students, teachers, or school district employees to personally affirm, adopt, or adhere to inherently divisive concepts. "Inherently divisive concepts," means advancing any ideas in violation of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, including, but not limited to, any of the following concepts:
  - (i) that one race, color, religion, sex, ethnicity, or national origin is inherently superior to another race, color, religion, sex, ethnicity, or national origin;
  - (ii) that an individual should be discriminated against or adversely treated solely or partly on the basis of his or her race, color, religion, sex, ethnicity, or national origin,
  - (iii) that an individual's moral character is inherently determined by his or her race, color, religion, sex, ethnicity, or national origin,
  - (iv) that an individual, by virtue of the individual's race, color, religion, sex, ethnicity, or national origin, is inherently racist, sexist, or oppressive, whether consciously or subconsciously,
  - (v) that an individual, by virtue of the individual's race, color, religion, sex, ethnicity, or national origin, is responsible for actions committed in the past by other members of the same race, color, religion, sex, ethnicity, or national origin, or
  - (vi) that meritocracy or traits, such as a strong work ethic, are racist or sexist, or were created by a particular race or sex to oppress members of another race or sex.

Grantee's noncompliance with the requirements of this section may be grounds for termination of this Agreement. Grantee shall include the provisions of this section in each sub-agreement, so that the provisions shall be binding upon each subgrantee.

#### 20. TERMINATION PROVISION

- a. NON-APPROPRIATION: This Agreement depends upon the continued availability of appropriated funds and expenditure authority from the Legislature for this purpose. If for any reason the Legislature fails to appropriate funds or grant expenditure authority, or funds become unavailable by operation of law, this Agreement will be terminated by SHPO. Termination for any of these reasons is not a default by SHPO nor does it give rise to a claim against SHPO.
- b. TERMINATION FOR CAUSE: This Agreement may be terminated by SHPO in the event the Grantee breaches any of the terms or conditions hereof at any time with or without notice. If termination for such a default is effected by SHPO, any payments

due to the Grantee at the time of termination may be adjusted to cover any additional costs to SHPO because of Grantee's default. If after SHPO terminates for a default by Grantee it is determined that Grantee was not at fault, then the Grantee shall be paid for eligible services rendered and expenses incurred up to the date of termination.

## RESTRICTIVE COVENANT AND DECLARATION OF PRESERVATION RESTRICTIONS

This Restrictive Covenant and Declaration of Preservation Restrictions, hereinafter "Covenant", is made and, hereinafter entered on this day of, 20, entered to as "Grantors". This Covenant grants certain covenants to, and in favor of, the State of South Dakota State Historical Society/ Office of History, State of South Dakota, 900 Governors Drive, Pierre, S.D. 57501, hereinafter "SDSHS" and "Grantee".
GRANTOR, in consideration of certain financial benefits provided by the SDSHS for restoration or rehabilitation activities performed upon the following described real property:
Legal Description: Lots 1-5, Block 41, Grant Crossing Addition to the City of Mobridge, Walworth County South Dakota

hereinafter referred to as "The Property", and pursuant to the requirements of SDCL 1-19A-21, HEREBY DECLARES, AGREES AND COVENANTS as follows:

- TERM. This Covenant shall have a term of, and run with The Property for, a period of eight (8) years from its date of execution, and shall bind Grantors' assignees or successors for that time period as if those 1. assignees or successors had executed this Covenant.
- MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR. Grantor agrees to perform and assume the cost of maintenance and repair of The Property to preserve the architectural, historic, or archaeological characteristics of The 2. Property that resulted in The Property being eligible for receipt of a Deadwood Grant from the SDSHS, for the term of this Covenant. This Covenant does not prohibit Grantor from seeking other financial assistance from any available source so long as that assistance does not interfere with any of the terms and conditions of this Covenant.
- PUBLIC BENEFIT REQUIREMENT. During the term of this Covenant, The Property shall be, and hereby is, dedicated for the public benefit and open to the public for not less than twelve (12) hours each 3. year on an equitably spaced basis, and shall be open at other times by appointment. Grantor may charge a reasonable nondiscriminatory admission fee for access to The Property, which fee shall be comparable to fees charged at similar facilities in the area. If The Property is open to the public only for twelve (12) hours per year, Grantor agrees to and will publish a notice of the dates and hours The Property is open. This notice shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area in which The Property is located. This Paragraph 3 does not apply, and the public benefit requirement is presumptively considered satisfied, when the work, for which the financial incentive was received from the SDSHS, was for

mechanical or electrical systems on The Property that cannot be viewed, or for exterior work on The Property that can be viewed from a public right-of-way.

- 4. PRIOR NOTIFICATION FOR PROPOSED WORK. Grantor hereby agrees to issue written prior notification to Grantee and the SDSHS, at the addresses above, of any proposed project or work on The Property proposed to be initiated during the term of this Covenant that may affect the historic integrity or significance of The Property. Grantor shall obtain prior written approval of all such projects from Grantee and the SDSHS prior to initiation of the project. Grantor understands and agrees that all work performed on The Property will comply with the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Interior's <u>Standards</u> for the Treatment of Historic Properties.
- 5. FILING WITH REGISTER OF DEEDS. Grantor shall file an executed original of this Covenant with the Register of Deeds for the county in which The Property is located, and shall forward a copy of the executed, filed Covenant to SDSHS and Grantee at the address above as proof of filing.
- 6. CHANGE IN OWNERSHIP. Grantor agrees to notify Grantee at the address above, of any change in ownership of The Property occurring within the term of this Covenant. This notification shall be in writing, mailed within ten (10) days of the date on which a change in ownership of The Property occurred.
- 7. ENFORCEMENT OF COVENANT. Grantee, through the SDSHS, has the right to enforce the terms and conditions of this Covenant in all manners allowed by law. Grantee, through the SDSHS, also has the right to recover all financial benefits applied to The Property as consideration for this Covenant, if Grantor fails to comply with the terms and conditions of this Covenant.
